

Wildlife & Fisheries Specialist Academy

Purpose

The purpose of the Wildlife & Fisheries Specialist Academy is to provide advanced training whereby master volunteers can support or expand specific county educational programs of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service. The goal of the Wildlife & Fisheries Specialist Academy is not to produce "experts", rather to identify Master Volunteers who have received highly specialized training to support specific natural resource-related programs or projects. Such projects may include educational projects such as training other master volunteers, clientele presentations, and/or applied research and demonstrations.

Leadership

Leadership and instruction for this course provided by Dr. Todd Sink, Dr. John Tomecek and Dr. Maureen Frank, with coordination provided by Mary Pearl Meuth.

Certification

After completing Specialist training, volunteers are asked to serve as a local county resource and contribute volunteer service by training other Master Volunteers and the public. Volunteers should document and report volunteer service hours specific to this program through their standard Volunteer Service Project reporting system. These hours may applicable to be applied to required volunteer hours needed to maintain one's master volunteer certification for the year.

Classroom sessions will be held in the mornings at the **AgriLife Turf Research Facility** (3100 F&B Road, College Station, TX) and field based sessions in the afternoon.
